BACKGROUND

The China Trade Tracker

Launched in 2021 by the China-Britain Business Council (CBBC), the China Trade Tracker is a comprehensive reference offering key facts and figures on UK-China trade – with a particular focus on regional British export trends. It is updated on a half-yearly basis.

Issue Thirteen of the Tracker provides an overview of the goods trade between the UK's 12 regions and devolved administrations and China in 2025 (1 January to 31 December 2025). Unless stated otherwise, references to 'China' in this report include Hong Kong.

HMRC Data

This report uses HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) data, which offers a breakdown of UK goods trade by region. HMRC trade totals are slightly lower than comparable data from the Office of National Statistics (ONS) due to differences in data collection and handling.

Hong Kong Data

This Tracker incorporates Hong Kong to provide a more complete view of UK-China trade flows. It is important to note, however, that Hong Kong functions as an important regional trading hub, so a notable share of goods recorded there will subsequently be exported to other markets.

Foreword

Peter Burnett – CEO of China-Britain Business Council



This edition of the CBBC Trade Tracker comes at a time when UK businesses are starting to see the real benefits from greater G2G and G2B engagement with China across the spectrum of trade and investment. In September 2025, the UK and China held their first Joint Economic and Trade Commission (JETCO) in seven years, and we have seen a direct correlation with increased business exchanges and a renewed commitment to practical economic cooperation. Against a backdrop of global uncertainty, the resilience of UK-China trade demonstrates the enduring importance of the relationship for businesses in both countries.

This edition of the Tracker shows that UK goods exports to China and Hong Kong rose by 8.2% in 2025 to £23.7 billion, marking a second consecutive year of growth and reaffirming China as the UK's fourth-largest goods export market. Export growth was broad-based, with ten of the UK's twelve regions recording higher exports than the previous year, and five achieving double-digit growth.

It remains the case that the UK runs an overall trade deficit in goods with China, and that closing that gap will take sustained effort. But the substantive growth in exports across most of our regions tells an encouraging story: from pharmaceuticals to power-generating machinery, British industry is producing the kind of goods that China's economy increasingly demands as it invests in advanced manufacturing, clean energy, and industrial upgrading.

Moreover, alongside the June 2026 JETCO, when Commerce Minister Wang Wentao visited the UK, MofCom and DBT (supported by CBBC) organised an "Export to China" event to encourage UK exporters to focus on the opportunities in the China market.

There is a solid foundation to work with China to boost our exports further, building on the progress we have already been making in recent months. Alongside growth in the goods trade, UK-China trade in services has also demonstrated resilience, with the UK recording a services trade surplus of £11.7 billion in 2025, while continued expansion across key sectors is creating new opportunities for businesses and strengthening the foundations of the bilateral economic relationship.

CBBC remains committed to supporting businesses across every region of the UK to succeed in China, helping them identify opportunities, navigate market challenges, and build lasting commercial partnerships that strengthen one of the UK's most important international trading relationships.

China and the UK Economy

Economic ties with China remain an important contributor to UK growth. Including Hong Kong, China ranks fourth among the UK's top export destinations, making it a market of enduring strategic importance for British businesses.

The two economies are increasingly complementary. British companies are well placed to meet Chinese demand for premium consumer brands, specialised manufacturing, and advanced technologies, while imports from China help keep costs down for UK consumers and provide vital components for British manufacturers and supply chains.

The relationship extends well beyond trade. Chinese and Hong Kong students make up the UK's largest international cohort, with 159,955 enrolled in universities during the 24/25 academic year, making them a vital source of income for higher education institutions. Chinese-owned businesses also employ over 57,000 people in the UK, while Chinese investment continues to support economic activity across a range of sectors.

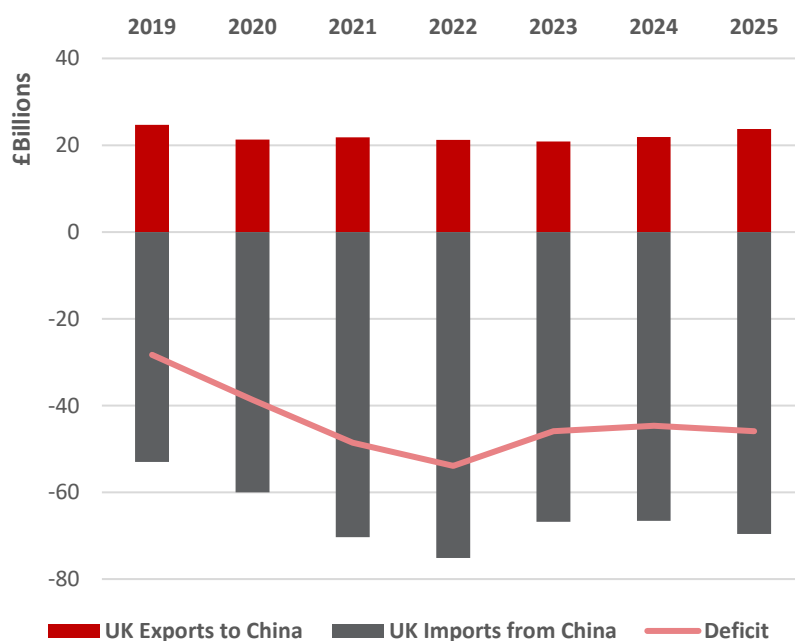
Although China continues to face significant economic headwinds, including subdued consumer confidence, housing market pressures, and a more uncertain global trading environment, its economy has proved more resilient than expected. Consumer spending and exports have continued to expand, and the IMF forecasts economic growth of around 4.5% in 2026. Combined with shifts in global supply chains, this resilience could create fresh opportunities for UK exporters and investors.

Executive Summary

The CBBC Trade Tracker provides a snapshot of regional UK goods exports to China (including Hong Kong) in 2025, based solely on HMRC data.

Key findings in this report include:

National-level Insights (2025)

- UK goods exports to China rose by **8.2%** to **£23.7 billion**, an increase from 2024 where a growth rate of 1.0% was recorded.
- Of the UK's total goods exports to China, **£13.1 billion (55.3%)** went to Mainland China and **£10.6 billion (44.7%)** to Hong Kong, highlighting the city-region's importance.
- The UK's **top** export to China, power-generating machinery and equipment, grew **38.7%** to **£7.12 billion**, while road vehicles fell **24.6%** to **£2.6 billion**.

Regional Comparative Insights (2025)

- England's North East recorded the fastest growth in exports to China at **38.6%**, followed by England's East Midlands (**28.3%**), and England's South West (**21.9%**).
- **Ten** out of **12** UK regions saw growth in exports to China, up from seven in 2024.
- The UK's largest exporters to China were the East Midlands (**£4.53bn**), London (**£2.84bn**), the West Midlands (**£2.76bn**), the South West (**£2.26bn**), the North West (**£2.15bn**), and Scotland (**£1.78bn**).
- Of all UK regions, the East Midlands ran a trade surplus with China, while Northern Ireland recorded the **largest** deficit.
- Of all UK regions, the East Midlands had the **highest** share of its exports to China going to Hong Kong (**85.5%**), while Northern Ireland was the **most** reliant on Mainland China, with **85.9%** of its China exports directed there.

Regional Insights (2025)

- The North East recorded the UK's fastest export growth to China, with exports rising **38.6%** to **£936 million**, driven by a **315%** increase in pharmaceutical products.
- The East Midlands remained the UK's largest exporter to China for a fifth consecutive year, with exports reaching a record **£4.53 billion**.
- Scotland's exports to China rose **16.8%** to **£1.78 billion**, supported by a **38.9%** increase in petroleum exports and a **42.1%** rise in fish and seafood exports.
- Welsh exports of power-generating machinery and equipment rose **54.7%** to **£325 million**.
- The South West recorded a fifth consecutive year of export growth, with shipments to China rising **21.9%** to **£2.26 billion** as power-generating machinery exports climbed to a record **£1.32 billion**.
- The South East reversed four consecutive years of decline, with exports to China increasing **8.6%**.
- Major regional declines in exports to China were concentrated in the Road Vehicles category, with exports from the North West and West Midlands falling by **27.3%** and **26.9%**, respectively.

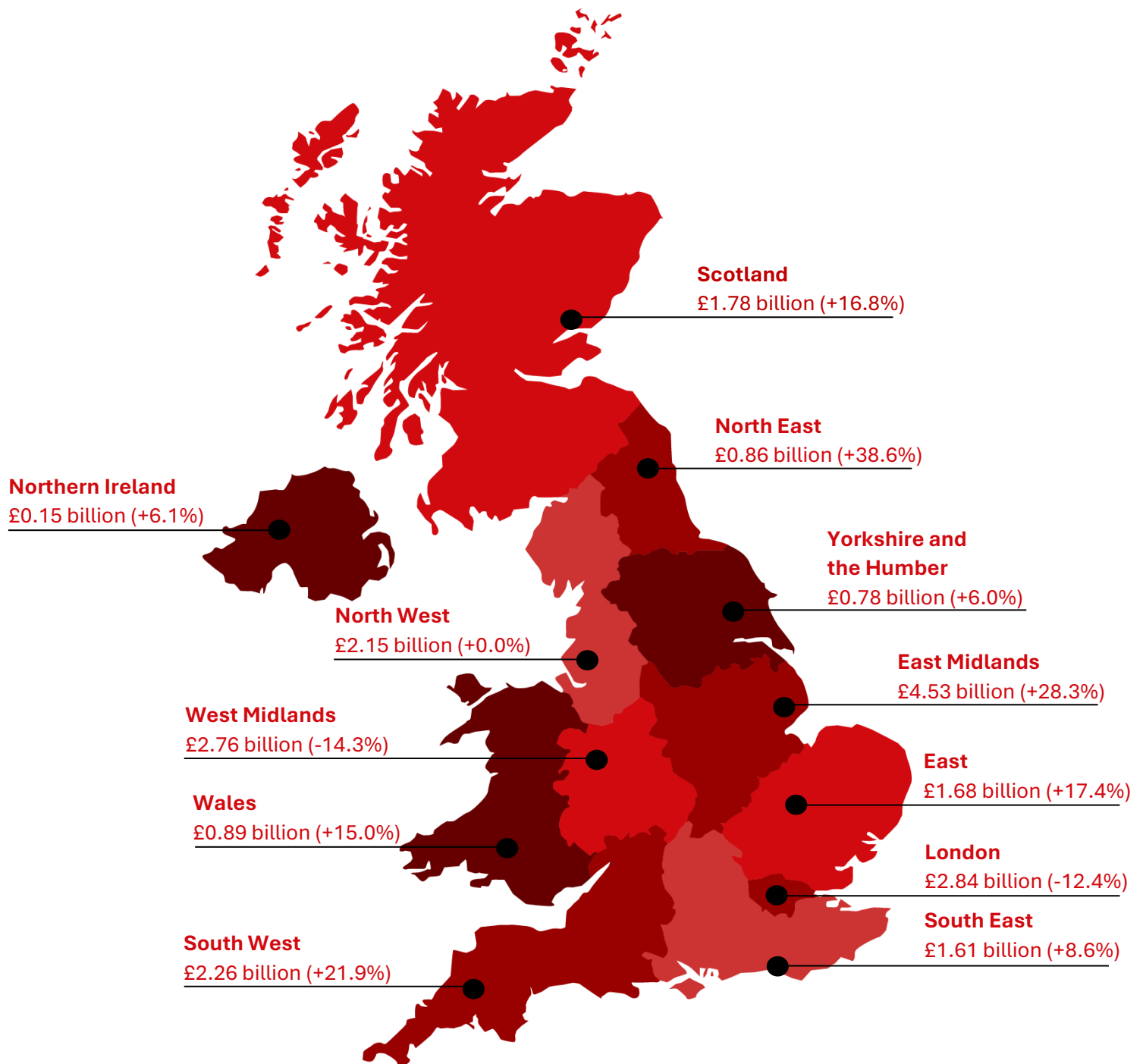

Total Exports by Area in 2025 (YoY change)

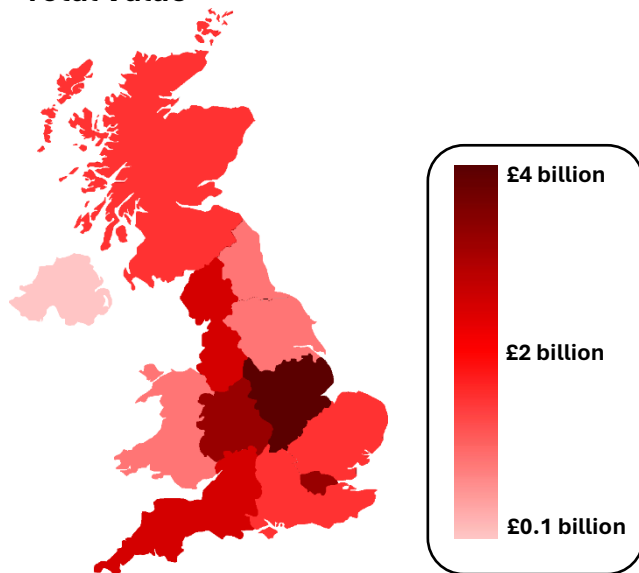

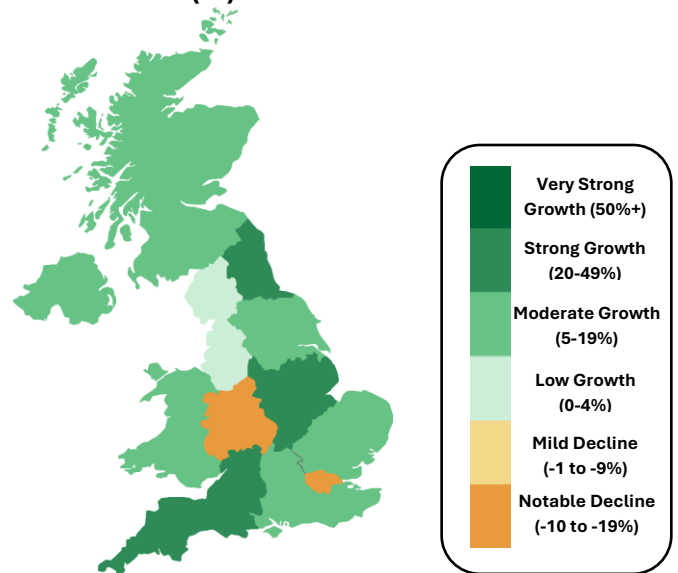

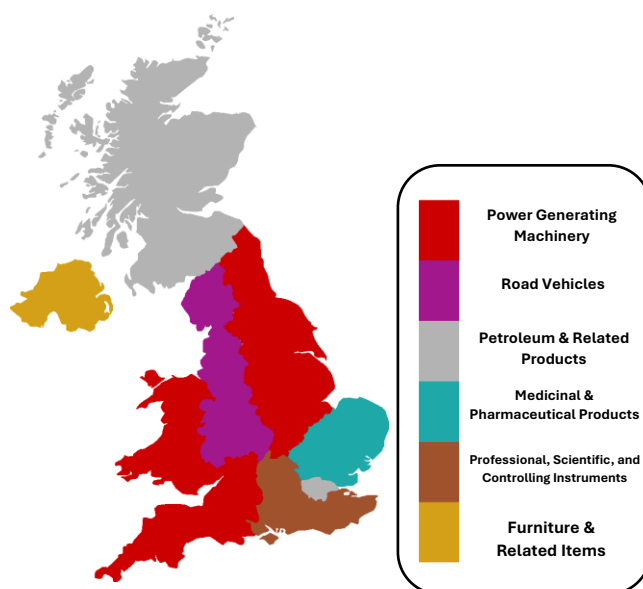

Total Value**



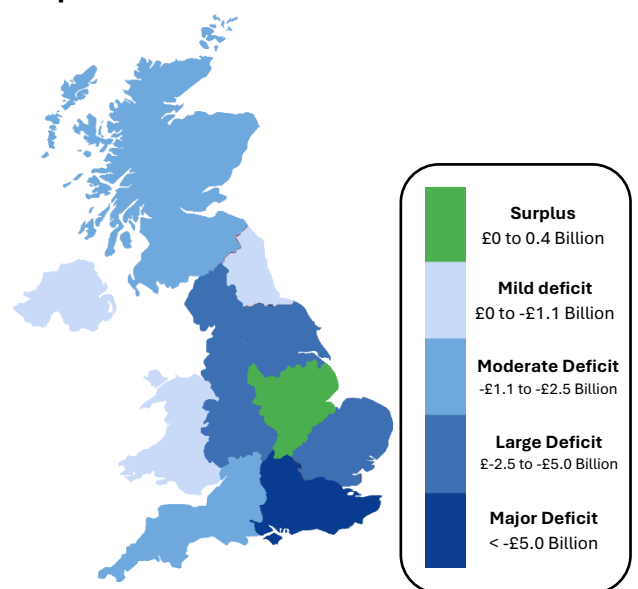
**Goods Exports to China:

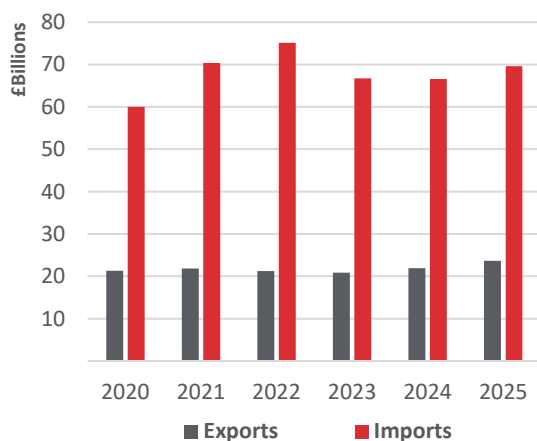

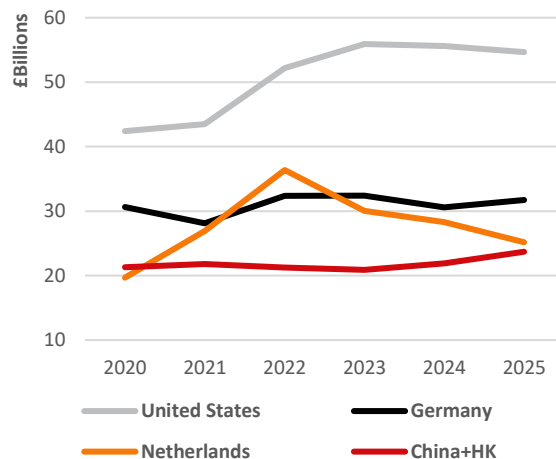
Trade Insights

- UK goods exports to China (inc. HK) rose **8.2%** to **£23.7 billion** in 2025, growing substantially from 2024 and marking the second consecutive year of growth, as well as making China the UK's fourth-largest goods export market.
- Of the UK's total exports to China, **£13.1 billion (55.3%)** went to Mainland China and **£10.6 billion (44.7%)** to Hong Kong.
- A **38.7%** rise in Power Generating Machinery, the UK's largest export to China, more than compensated for the **£900 million** decline resulting from the **24.6%** fall in Road Vehicle exports.
- Among the UK's top eight export subcategories, Non-Ferrous Metals rose **64.6%**, supported by China's plan to expand its non-ferrous metals industry and EV supply chain.

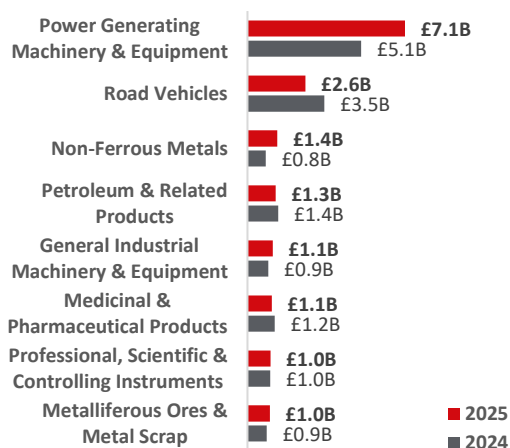
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



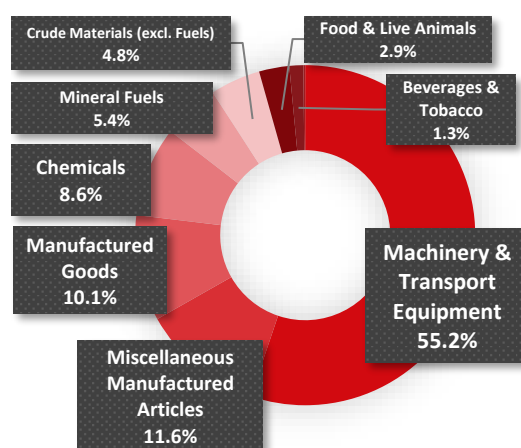
UK Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

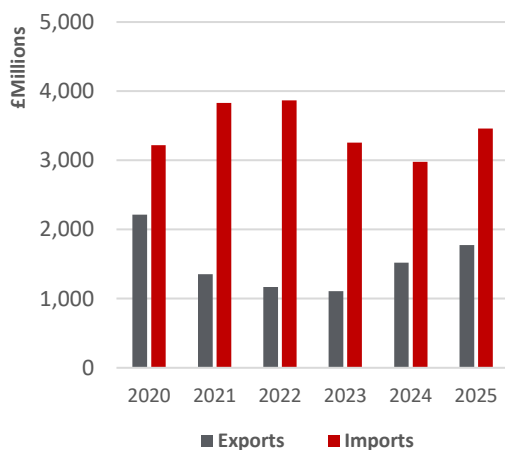

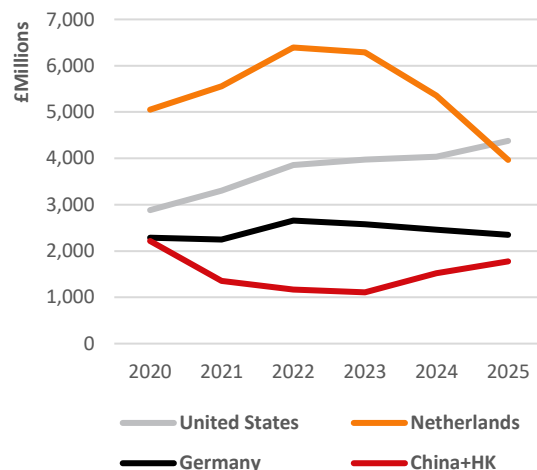
Trade Insights

- Scotland's goods exports to China (inc. HK) grew **16.8%** to **£1.78 billion** in 2025, reaching their highest level since 2020.
- Petroleum exports rose **38.9%** to **£566 million**, likely due to the ongoing war in Ukraine, as teapot refineries in China have favoured easier-to-process North Sea crude over sanction-risky Russian oil.
- Beverage exports fell **12.0%**, as demand in China weakened and competition with local brands remained fierce. Optimism remains, as China's import tariff on Scotch whiskey was lowered to **5%** during Prime Minister Keir Starmer's visit in January 2026.

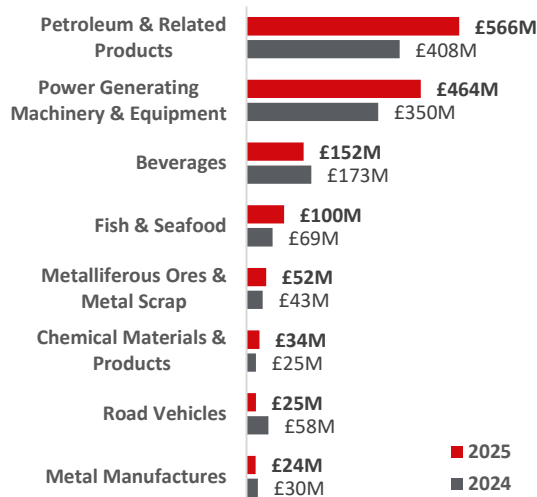
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



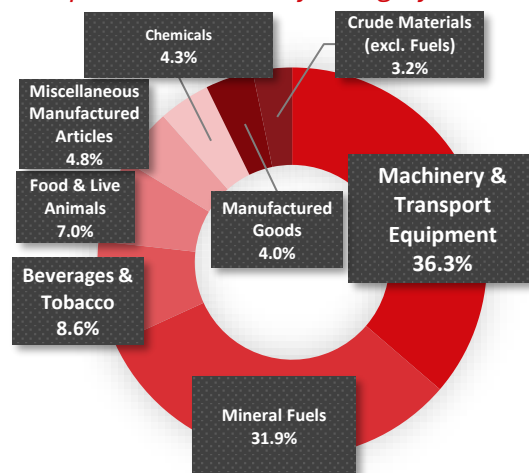
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

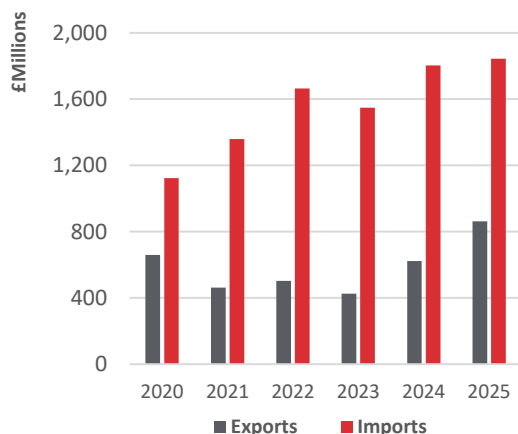

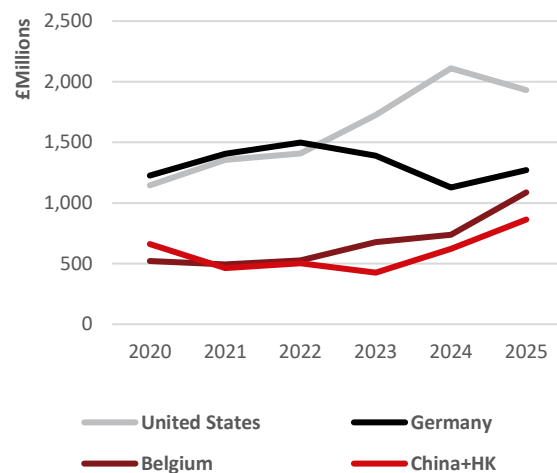
Trade Insights

- Goods exports from England's North East to China (inc. HK) grew **38.6%** to a record **£863 million** in 2025, the fastest rate in the UK.
- The North East's largest export, Power-Generating Machinery, rose **83.0%** to **£289 million**, in part due to the region's strong manufacturing cluster in Teesside and Tyneside, as well as China's increased demand for grid equipment.
- The North East's other top-performing export subcategories, Non-Ferrous Metals (**103.0%**) and Pharmaceutical Products (**333.3%**), surged, reflecting Chinese demand for industrial metals and the region's rising pharmaceutical and biotechnology strengths.

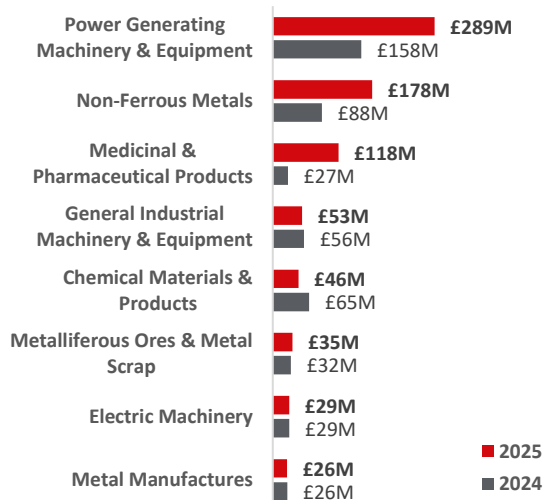
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



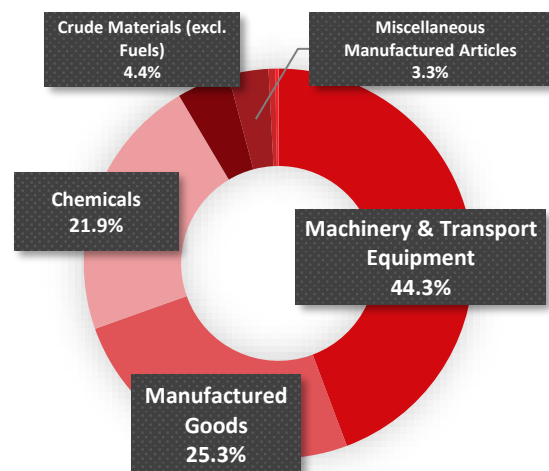
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

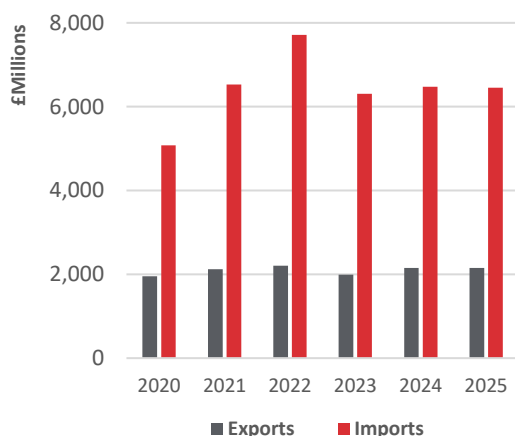

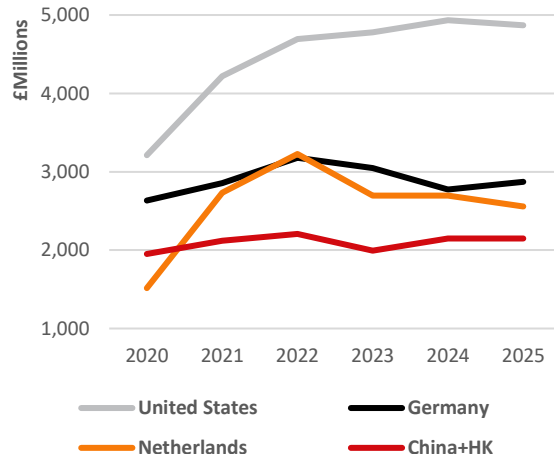
Trade Insights

- North West goods exports to China (inc. HK) stabilised at **0.0% growth** in 2025, making it the only UK region with no substantive changes to its export volume.
- The region's top export, Road Vehicles, declined **27.3%** to **£575 million**, reflecting stronger demand for Chinese-made electric vehicles and ongoing adjustments at local factories as they expand electrified vehicle production.
- Of the North West's top eight exports, Metalliferous Ores saw the fastest growth at **127.2%**, owing to China's high demand for metal inputs used for batteries, coupled with Liverpool and Manchester's ability to handle large volumes of recyclable metals.

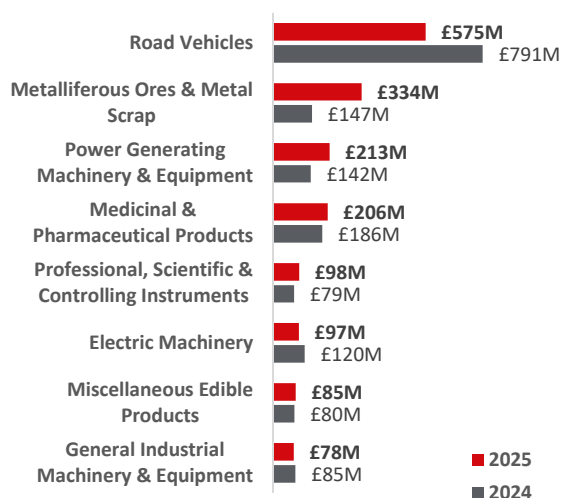
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



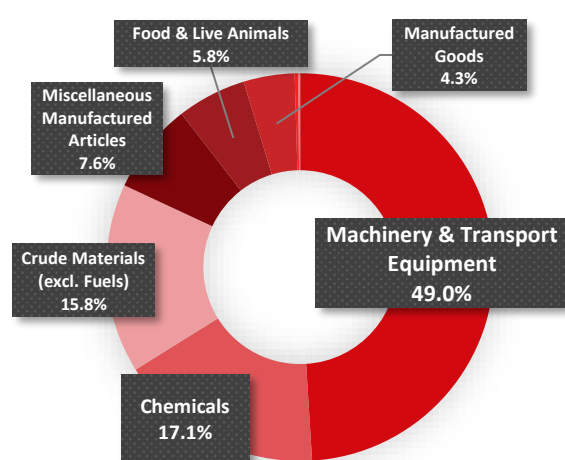
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

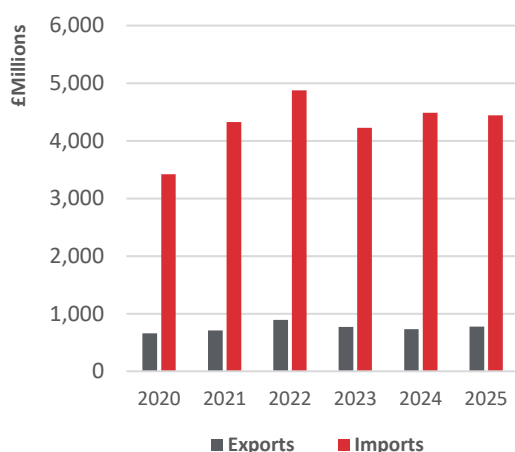

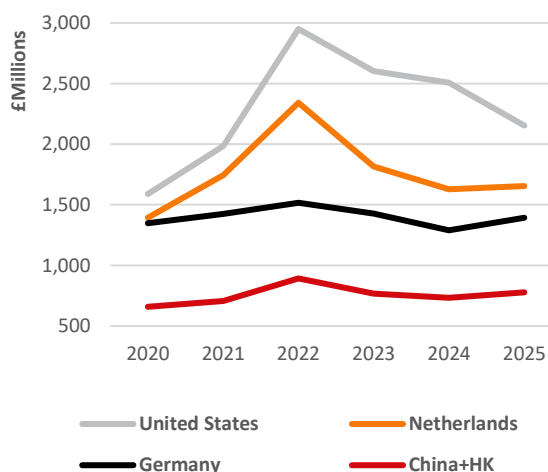
Trade Insights

- Yorkshire and the Humber's exports to China (inc. HK) rose **6.0%** to **£778 million** in 2025, reversing the **4.7%** decline of 2024.
- Power Generating Machinery exports climbed **51.5%** to **£145 million**, buoyed by Chinese demand for equipment critical to the advanced manufacturing sector and produced in industrial centres including Rotherham and Hull.
- Smaller categories, namely Photographic and Optical Goods and Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles, also recorded strong growth, rising **287%** and **86%** to **£17 million** and **£28 million**, respectively.

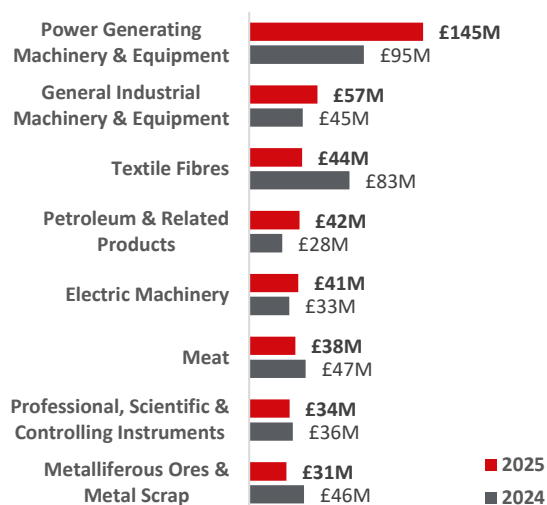
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



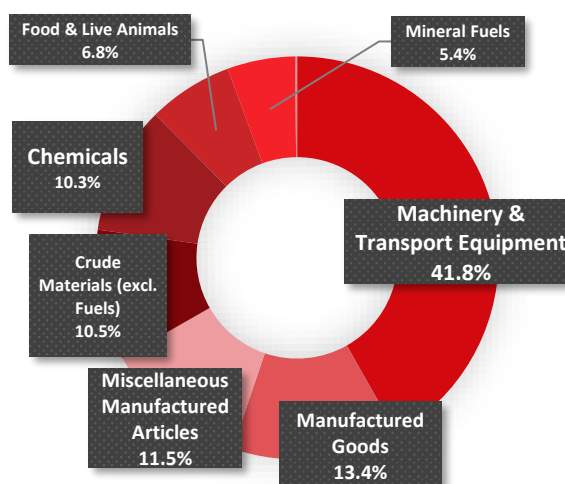
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

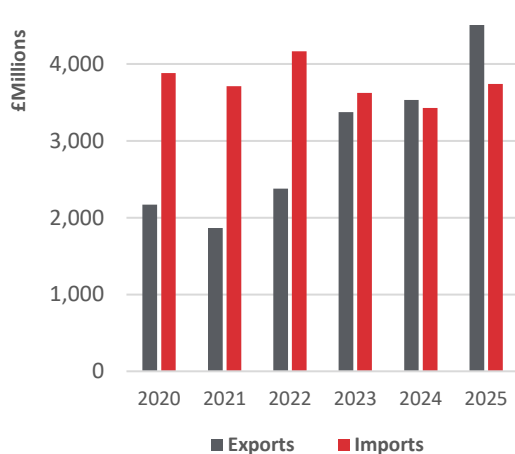

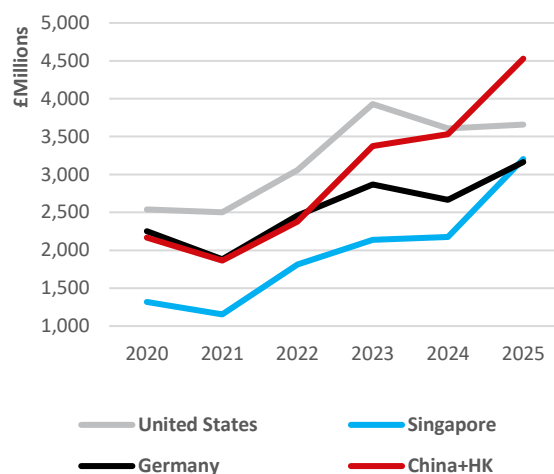
Trade Insights

- The East Midlands was the UK's largest exporter to China in 2025, with exports rising **28.3%** to **£4.53 billion**, marking a fourth consecutive year of growth and an increase of **£2.7 billion** since 2021.
- The East Midlands was the only region to record an export surplus with China (**+£790 million**), while 2025 marked the first year China overtook the US as its top export partner.
- Power-Generating Machinery, the region's top export category, recorded strong growth of **27.8%** to **£3.42 billion**, accounting for **14%** of total UK exports to China.

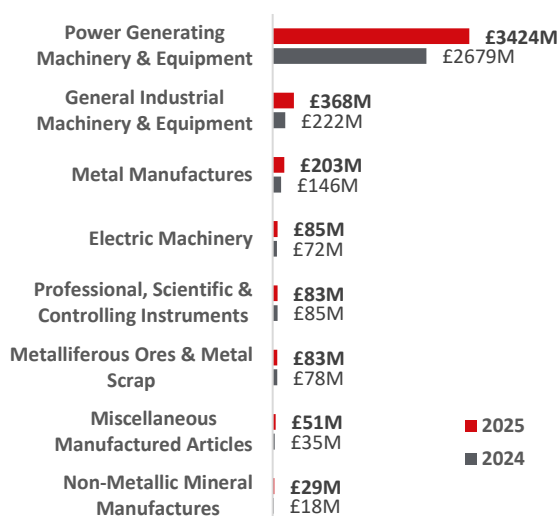
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



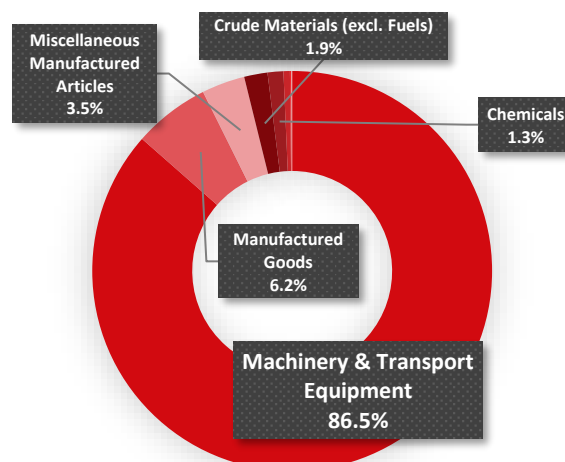
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

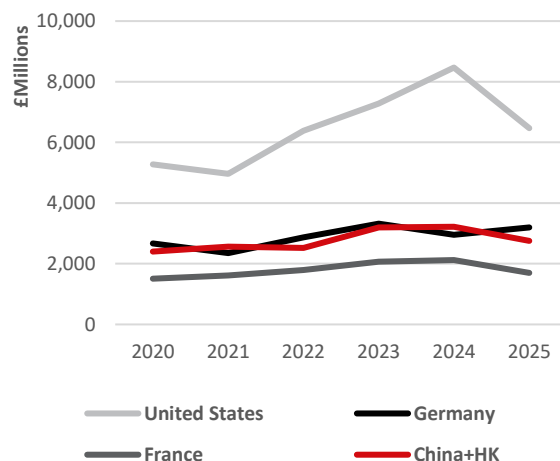
Trade Insights

- The West Midlands' goods exports to China (inc. HK) fell **14.3%** to **£2.76 billion** in 2025. This is the first time since 2023 that the region's export value to China has fallen below London's.
- This fall was largely due to a decline of **26.9%** in the region's top export, Road Vehicles – mirroring declines seen across other regions in this same category.
- As a result, Germany surpassed China as the West Midlands' second-biggest export destination in 2025.

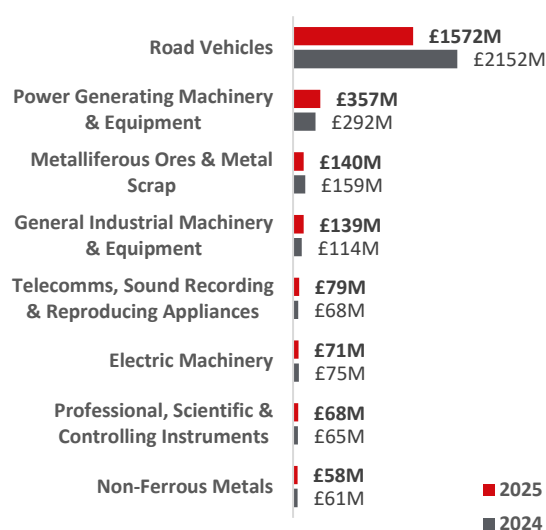
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



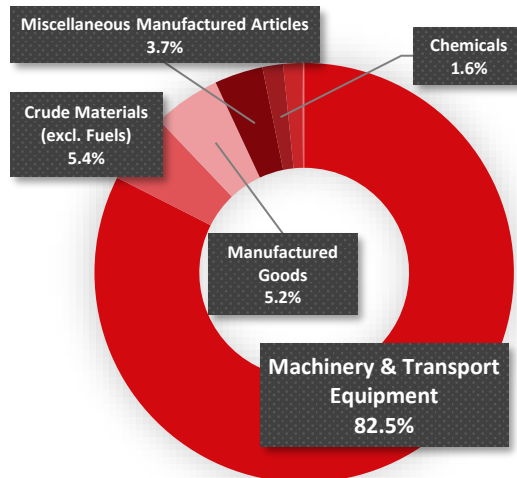
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China



Top 8 Export Subcategories to China (£M)



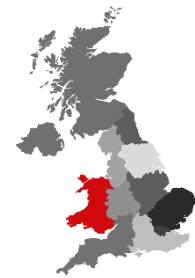

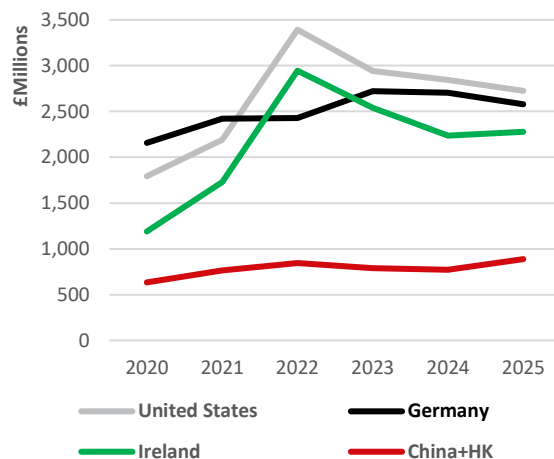
Trade Insights

- Welsh exports to China (inc. HK) rose **15.0%** to a record **£886 million** in 2025, while the region's imports fell by **1.1%**, the largest decrease of all regions.
- Increases in exports were mainly driven by a **54.7%** increase in the region's top export subcategory, Power Generating Machinery, supported by major gas turbine manufacturing facilities, including those in Nantgarw, South Wales.
- China (inc. HK) is the seventh most popular goods export destination for Wales and recorded the highest growth among Wales' top ten export partners.

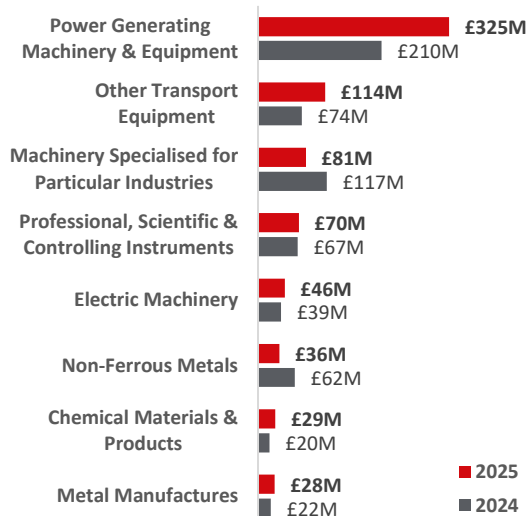
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



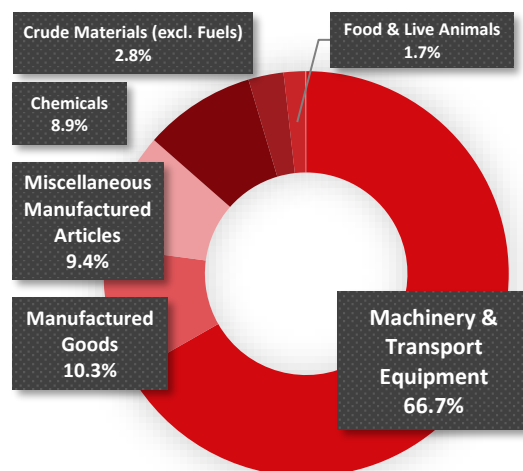
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

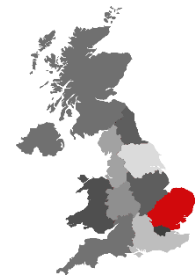

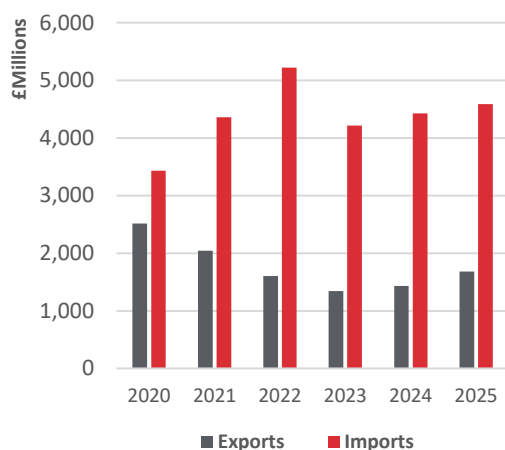

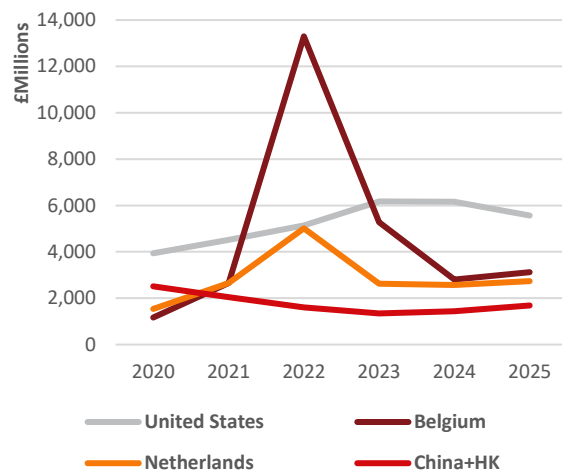
Trade Insights

- Exports from the East of England to China (inc. HK) rose **17.4%** to **£1.55 billion** in 2025, showing growth for the second year in a row.
- A decline in the region's top export, Medicinal & Pharmaceutical Products, by **2.5%**, was compensated by the growth of its second and third largest exports, Power Generating Machinery and Non-Ferrous Metals, by **151.9%** and **105.0%** respectively.
- The East of England remained the UK's largest exporter of meat, shipping **£42.9 million** in 2025, aided by processing facilities in Eye and Watton, as well as key shipping routes via Felixstowe port in Suffolk.

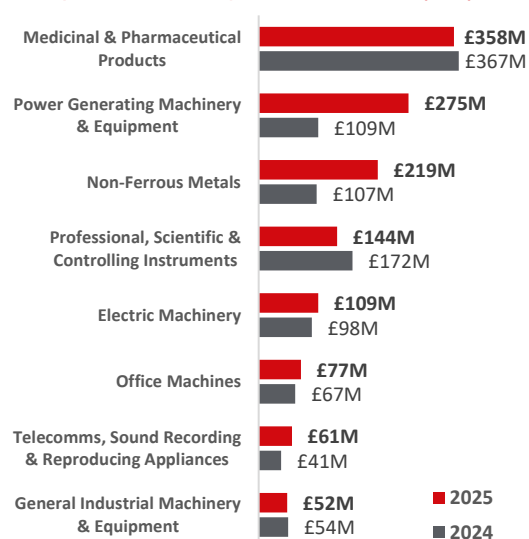
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



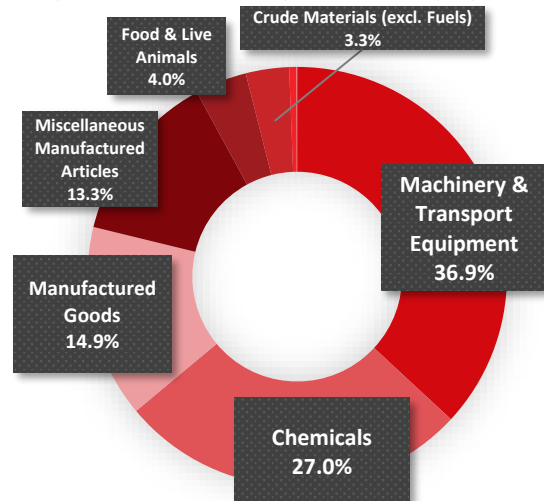
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

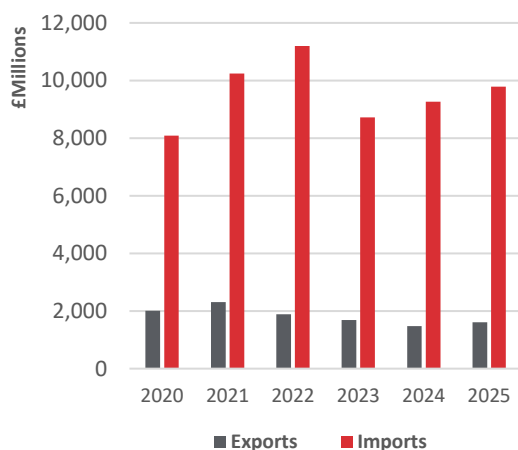

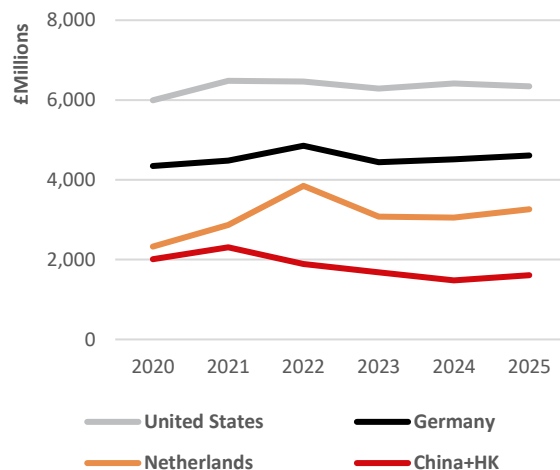
Trade Insights

- Goods exports to China (inc. HK) from the South East – the UK’s largest exporter overall – reversed its 4-year decline, growing by **8.6%** to **£1.61 billion** in 2025.
- Scientific Instruments overtook Road Vehicles as the region’s top export, valued at **£194 million**. Oxfordshire is one of the UK’s main production hubs for scientific laboratory instruments.
- Power Generating Machinery became the region’s second-largest export, up from sixth place, after exports surged **143.0%**.

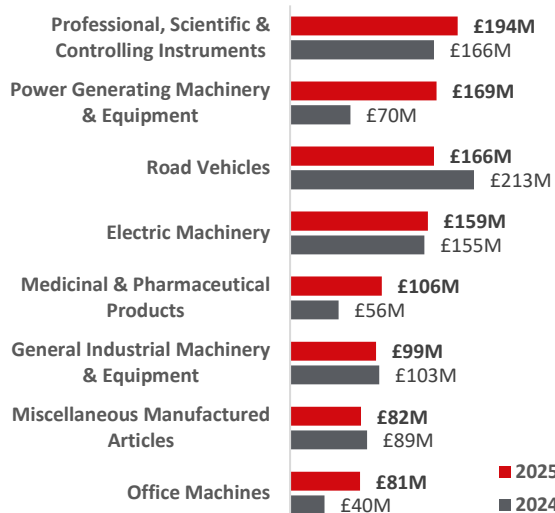
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



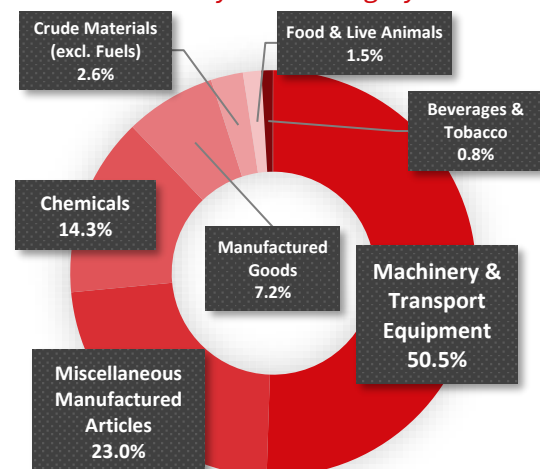
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

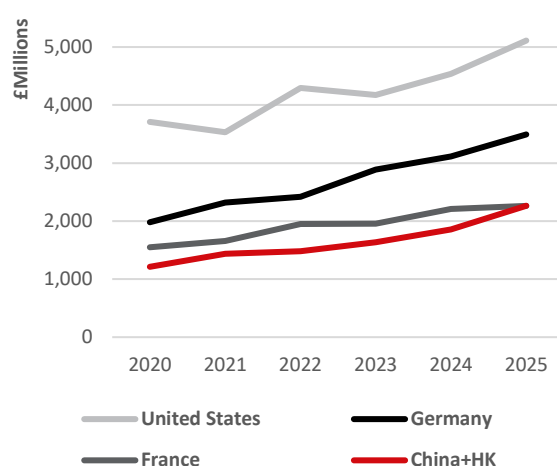
Trade Insights

- Exports from England's South West region to China (inc. HK) rose **21.9%** to **£2.26 billion** in 2025, marking a fifth consecutive year of export growth.
- China accounted for **1.1%** of the region's GDP, making the region the fourth most reliant on trade with China after the East and West Midlands and the North East.
- The region's largest export, Power Generating Machinery, grew **39.9%** to a record **£1.32 billion**.
- The South West was the UK's second-highest exporter of Other Transport Equipment, driven mainly by aerospace components used for China's expanding aviation industry.

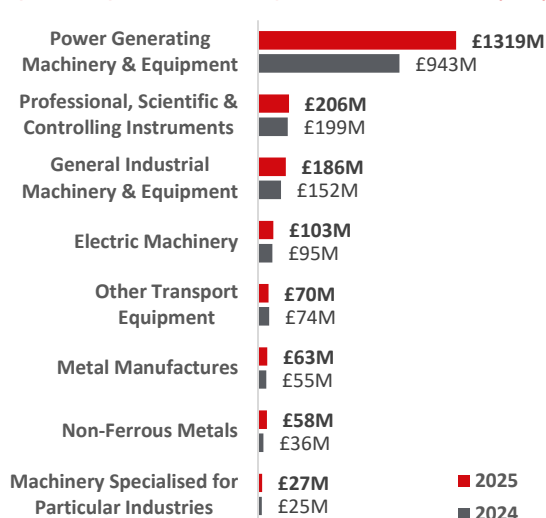
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



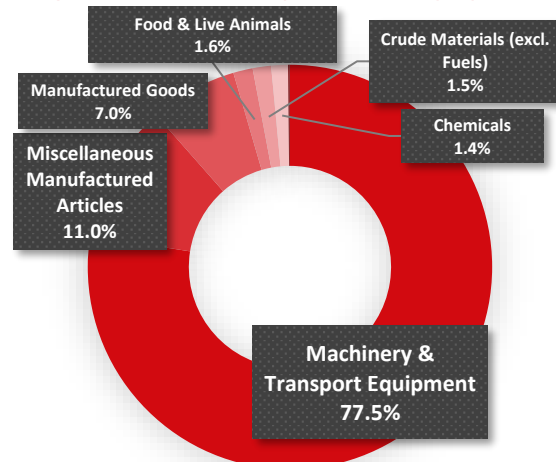
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

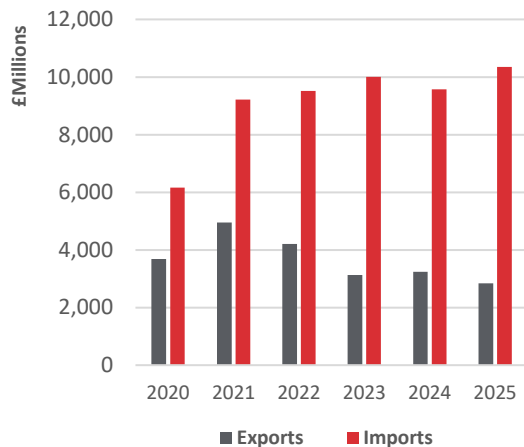

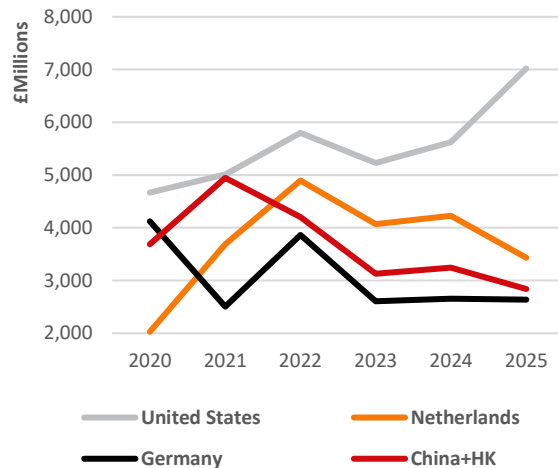
Trade Insights

- Exports from London to China (inc. HK) fell by **12.4%** to **£2.84 billion** in 2025. Despite this, the region became the second-largest exporter to China.
- London's top export, Petroleum, fell **34.0%**, likely due to contract reattribution rather than a real trade drop. Given the national total fell just **8.2%**, the figures reflect firms headquartered in the capital rather than physical activity.
- The capital city's second-highest export, Miscellaneous Articles, which includes luxury handbags and apparel, also saw a decrease in 2025, falling by **14.1%**, likely owing to low demand in China for consumer goods.

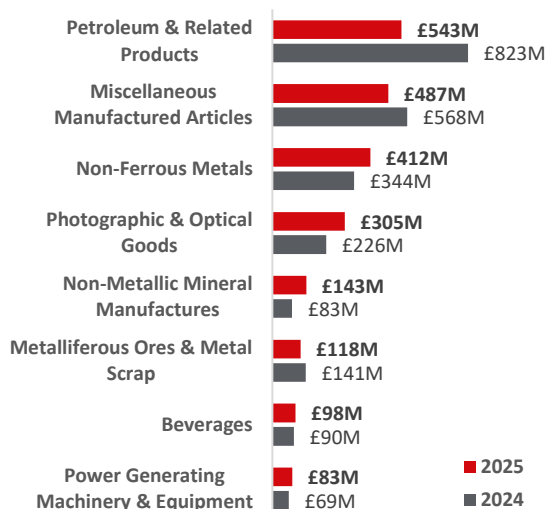
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



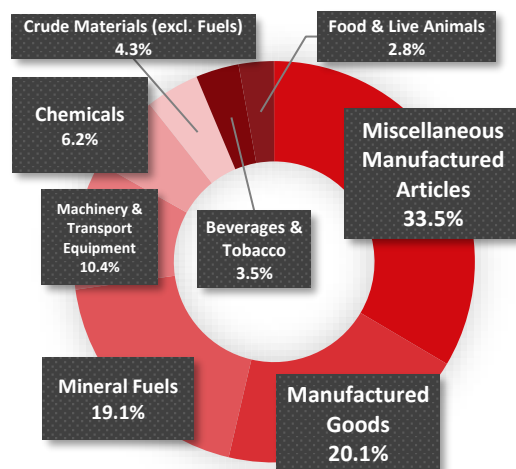
Regional Exports to Top Partners and China

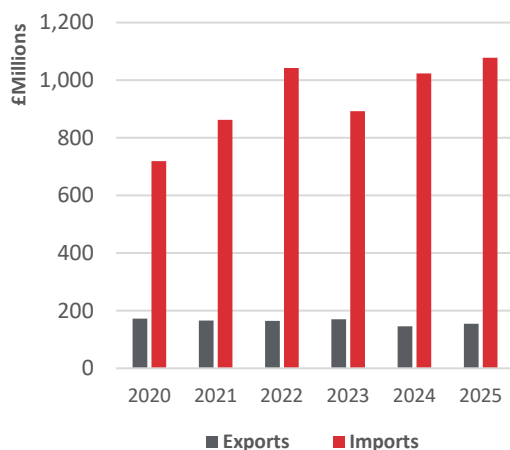

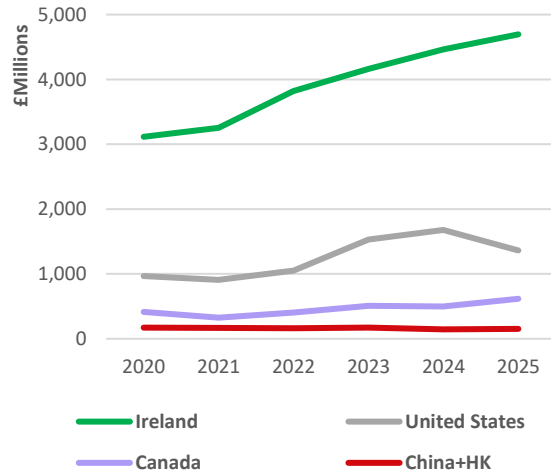
Trade Insights

- Northern Ireland's exports to China (inc. HK) grew by **6.1%** to **£154 million** in 2025, reversing the decline seen in 2024.
- Growth was driven by a **204.5%** increase in furniture exports to **£40.6 million**, a notable figure that reflects the region's long-established furniture manufacturing industry.
- Northern Ireland's previous top export to China, Medicinal & Pharmaceutical Products, fell by **24.1%** to **£24.3 million**, reversing the growth seen over the past two years. The region nevertheless accounted for just **2.2%** of UK exports in this category to China.

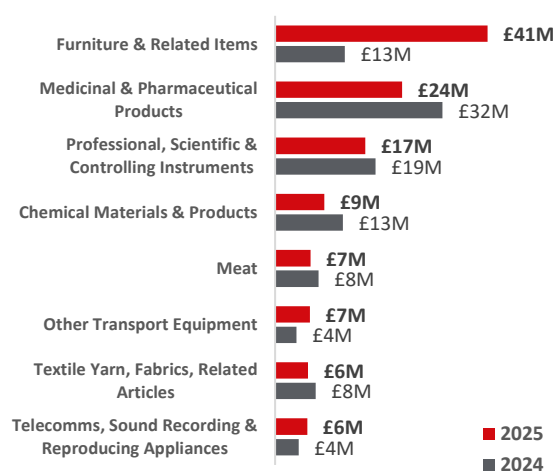
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2020



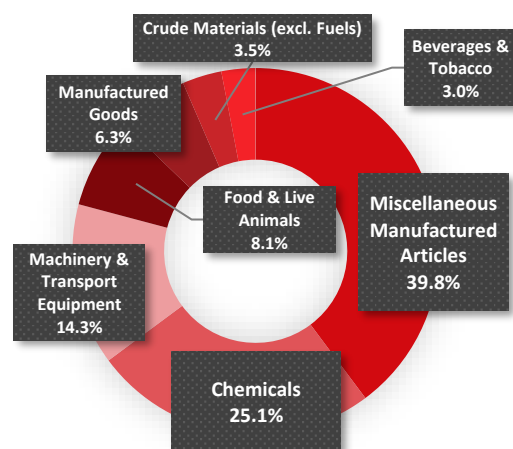
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

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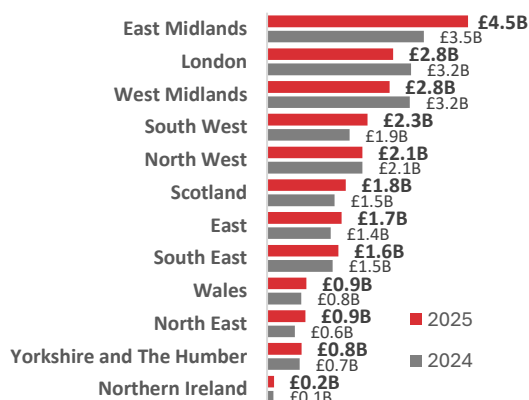

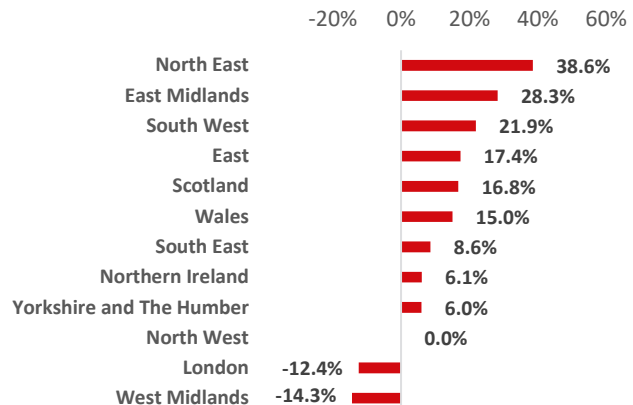
Comparative Regional Insights

- Top UK exporters were East Midlands (£4.53bn), London (£2.84bn), and West Midlands (£2.76bn), making up 20.3%, 12.7%, and 12.4% of total goods to China (inc. HK).
- The North East (38.6%), East Midlands (28.3%), and South West (21.9%) saw the **fastest** growth in their exports to China (inc. HK).
- **Ten** out of twelve UK areas saw China export growth in 2025, up from seven in 2024.
- **Only** the East Midlands ran a **trade surplus** with China.
- The East Midlands was the most reliant on Hong Kong (85.5% of its China and Hong Kong exports), while Northern Ireland was the most reliant on mainland China (85.9%).

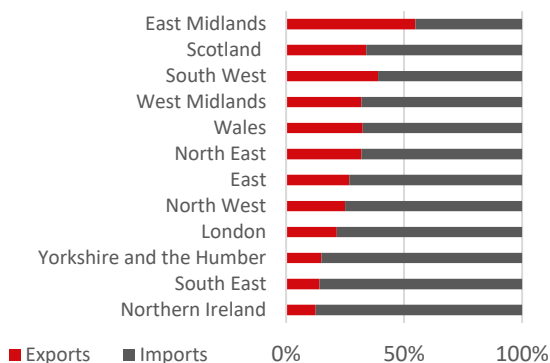
Regional Exports to China 2025 (£B)



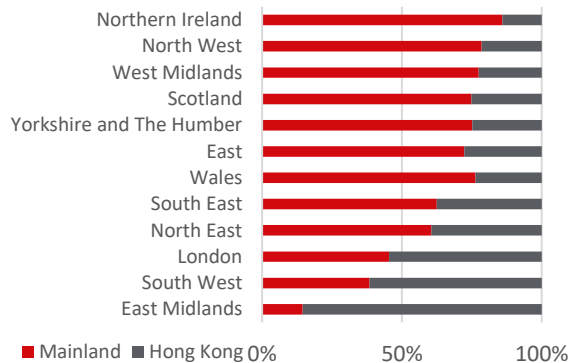
Regional Growth in China Goods Exports (%)



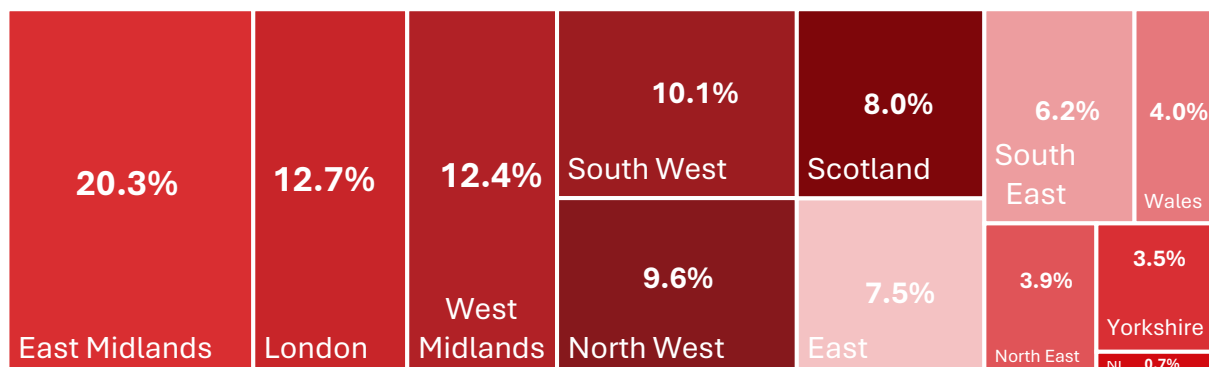
Balance of Trade with China 2025 (%)
